Promises! Promises! some need believing!

Someone once wrote. "God said it; I believe it; that settles it!" For some this might seem over simplistic, yet this is the foundation of faith, certainly of Abram's (later Abraham) faith.

Today's reading is at a relatively early stage in Abram's belief in God who had made himself known to Abram and had called him out of Ur and Harran. Already the Lord had promised, "in you all the families of the earth shall be blessed." Gen.12:3. A promise that would be fulfilled in Christ and then through Christ's Church. God had also promised him that his descendants would be as numerous as stars. Now God assures him, "I am your shield and your very great reward." v1 (NIV). Nothing can be more precious, no treasure more valuable than this assurance.

One of the wonderful things about God is that he is patient when we struggle to understand how he will fulfil his promises. Abraham struggled too! He dares to say effectively, 'that's great but I'm childless, I have no heir!' It's not him doubting God but expressing both a desire and a concern he can't fathom out, an indication of an honest and deepening relationship with the Lord. God's response is not to rebuke him for lack of faith but to give the promise of a son and heir bearing both Abraham's and Sarai's DNA. With nothing further to go on other than God's word to him, Abraham "believed the LORD, and he counted it to him as righteousness." 'God said it; I believe it; that settles it!" Nothing Abram did earned that right standing with God. It was a gift appropriated by believing God's promise. Here is the very foundation of God's covenant with us, of which we are reminded every time we come to Communion and the foundation of Paul's teaching in the New Testament.

How are we counted righteous before God? The same as Abraham. By faith, humbly believing God's promises and, for us, receiving Jesus Christ's gift of his unmerited favour of forgiveness and eternal life at the foot of the cross. Then, with confidence, we look forward to the sure fulfilment of his promises, "it is your Father's good pleasure to give you the kingdom," and "the Son of Man is coming at an hour you do not expect."
