It was interesting to reflect, as we journeyed with Jesus during those last days and hours during the Triduum, how the whole of our being and human emotions are expressed and experienced in the events of those times. There is adulation and joy; panic; anger; remorse; self-loathing; violent hatred; bitter isolation — a real emotional roller coaster — and there is a huge amount of fear. If we put ourselves in the position of those disciples; we can understand their sense of fear and confusion. All they'd put their deepest hopes in seemed to be violently dashed to pieces. All that seemed to be left was desolation and fear that they might be the next ones to be strung up on those horrific crosses.

Jesus comes right into the midst of this seemingly hopeless situation and restores sorrow to joy. With the words, "Peace be with you" he doesn't judge but gives the disciples the evidence they need to help them understand. They finally get to see and believe.
